Synthetic data is artificially generated data about people, entities and events that imitates real-world data. It is designed to resemble real data in terms of properties and patterns whilst safeguarding against privacy and confidentiality issues. It can increase data quality by addressing data gaps or bias. Synthetic data is going through a period of rapid growth driven by increases in computing power and advances in AI and machine learning. Synthetic data can be used to build a rapid prototype, train an AI model, or run scenarios on the strategic impact of a new initiative.
Smart Data Foundry have developed an agent-based modelling product Aizle to generate synthetic data, which has already provided customised data sets to organisations ranging from the Financial Conduct Authority to early-stage fintechs.
Access to the data will be provided to FinTechs that make it through the first gateway via a digital sandbox. Further details relating to access restrictions etc will be shared at the appropriate stage in the process
